

# SBC Seminary Presidents Reaffirm Baptist Faith & Message:

# <u>Declares Critical Race Theory</u> Incompatible


In a statement adopted in the Council's annual session, the seminary presidents assert that as "confessional institutions," the six seminaries stand "together in this classic statement of biblical truth." Additionally, the statement declares that while condemning "racism in any form," the seminaries agree that "affirmation of the Critical Race Theory, Intersectionality and any version of Critical Race Theory is incompatible with the Baptist Faith & Message."



Clearly, CRT is at the forefront of our cultural and denominational moment. The closer you look into its history, advocates and aims, the more troubling it becomes Critical Race Theory is not a biblical solution, stated Jason Allen, president of Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. Allen added, Given our national denominational history, causes and cures of racism are often emotionally charged, yet we need the moral and theological clarity to guard against racism, while also defending our most cherished beliefs: the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the inerrancy and sufficiency of Scripture.

Jamie Dew, president of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, said *Our condemnation of racism arises from the teachings of Christianity itself, not from any modern secular ideology. CRT is not endorsed by any of our faculty.* 

R. Albert Mohler, president of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary added, *The Convention has acknowledged our own history and moral responsibility. We make clear that racism has no rightful place within the SBC, our churches, or our entities. We are thankful for our African-American brothers and sisters, whose voices are needed and must be honored. We are not to be guided by secular ideologies, but by the Word of God alone and in the love of Christ.* 



For many of us, 2020 was a year to remember. We did everything from navigating to isolating and even moments of being frustrated. Certainly, 2020 brought many distractions that have left a mark on our ministries. Have you become like Joshua, where God told him in Joshua 7:10 to "stand up- what are you doing on the ground?" I'm writing to remind you that leaders don't quit. There is nothing more demonic and effective in Satan's lies than that of creating insignificance and faithlessness. The great builder, Nehemiah, knew the work he was tasked to do involved a struggle. Yet, he was an engaged builder who kept building in spite of distraction and adversity.

We can't afford to slow down the work of God nor can we retreat from our post due to feeling insignificant. The key is a resilient leadership found in Nehemiah 6:3, where he sent messengers to say "I am doing a great work and cannot come down. Why should I leave to come down to you?"

Distractions rob leaders of the great work that we are called to. I'm asking that you not level off, or not to settle for an adequate work. The work that God has tasked you to do is a GREAT WORK! So, lead and don't come off the wall. You are a BUILDER!
