2021 SBC Convention Wrap-Up

Two weeks ago in Nashville, TN, the largest gathering of Southern Baptists occurred in over 25 years. 15,726 registered messengers from across the country elected Ed Litton from Alabama as their new president with a 52% majority over Georgia pastor Mike Stone.

The Executive Committee (an 86-member body charged with acting on the SBC's behalf between annual meetings) drew opposition at multiple junctures, with messengers claiming the EC had too much authority and needed to be more accountable to the churches.

No official convention action was taken on Critical Race Theory. However, messengers adopted a broad resolution repudiating "any world view that denies that racism, oppression, or discrimination is rooted, ultimately, in anything other than sin."

Sixty-four new IMB missionaries were appointed to join the 3,631 missionaries already on the field. NAMB announced more than 8,200 new churches have been planted in the U.S and Canada in the past decade.

3rd Grader Forced to Remove "Jesus Love Me" Mask.





Lydia wanted to express her faith to her classmates but was told by school administration it was offensive and controversial. However, other students were allowed to wear a wide range of popular slogan masks expressing opinions. Alliance Defending

Freedom currently has a pending lawsuit against the school.

Russell Moore announces departure from ERLC.

Ending an occasional controversial eight-year tenure, as the head of the SBC's Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission, Moore accepted a position with Christianity Today. The ERLC has been a flashpoint of controversy, most notably Moore's public opposition to candidate and then President Trump. In 2016, he stated any evangelical who votes for Trump would have to, repudiate everything they believe." He later clarified by saying he "understood that many supporters were motivated by biblical convictions and

motivated by biblical convictions and voted their conscience." In protest, some SBC churches, the most high profile being Prestonwood, announced they would escrow their Cooperative Program funds in 2017. Those funds were later released.



The Persecution Connection Close to Home.

The country of Myanmar (formerly Burma) has recently battled a military coup along with the ongoing persecution of anyone who is not a Buddhist. *Open Doors World Watch* has Myanmar listed in the top 20 countries as the most dangerous for Christians. For many years, Northwest Association has been blessed to have a growing Burmese church that meets for worship in our Meadowview Mission Center. First Baptist Zo has a strong link to their persecuted brothers and sisters back in Myanmar. On most Sundays, the local fellowship led by Pastor Kham LaNang will have over one hundred in attendance.
