VBS TURNS 100 YEARS OLD IN LOUISIANA

... AND IT ALL STARTED IN CEDAR GROVE

In the summer of 1923 something occurred for children in Louisiana that had never been done before. A program developed in the early 1900's in New York City by Dr. Robert G. Boville, was brought to northwest Louisiana. Over several years the Rev. Luther Holmes and his wife had organized nearly 40

summer schools for children in the northern part of the country using Dr. Boville's teaching model. After some additional training that Holmes received at Southwestern Seminary, he had an opportunity to organize a summer school just south of Shreveport at the Cedar Grove Baptist Church.

The following is an excerpt from the July 22, 1923 Sunday edition of the Shreveport Times.

The first Vacation Bible School in the state is being held at Cedar Grove Baptist Church. Sessions for the school are held from Monday to Friday, from four to six weeks, and between 9 and 11:45am. The school has been successful in every way. The enrollment the first day was over 90. At the close, 277 children were enrolled. The Bible memory part has been from the Psalms and parts of the Old Testament as well as portions from the New Testament. The song periods have been used to familiarize the pupils with several of the finest of the church hymns as well as the more modern gospel songs. The Bible memory work and songs have been learned by only exercise of the mental powers, concentrated on the work of the moment. No mechanical devices such as the printed page has been permitted. The result has been that what the pupils have learned, they have really learned, not simply memorized for the minute.



I'm not old enough to recall a sheet of paper as a "mechanical device," but

clearly a century ago devices were not nearly as complicated as they are today. Pastors and church leaders, you should have no trouble enlisting VBS workers for a few days. Just tell them if they lived a hundred years ago, VBS would last all summer!

The community of Cedar Grove, Louisiana, incorporated in 1914. The church began the same year. Rev. L.F Maynard was pastor (1922-1925) when the first VBS was held at Cedar Grove. The church was located at 6501 Henderson Ave. The church changed its name in 1925 to Southside Baptist Church, and continued until their closing in 2022. Shreveport expanded south and annexed Cedar Grove into the city in 1927, thus ending the short thirteen year township of Cedar Grove.

Just a few hundred yards north of the former church location is the current Fairfield Elementary School. Further evidence of growth in the community in the early 1900's was the building of the Cedar Grove Public School in 1923. Fairfield Magnet will always bear the markings above its front doors when Cedar Grove was a town south of Shreveport.

This article is why churches should archive their history. Your past documents are a historical record of those who have





served the Lord before you. A special thanks to the former membership at Southside for preserving their rich history.

This summer, remember your Northwest Association, or as it was named then, the Caddo Association, was first in the state where VBS started.

SBC Presidency: Current President Bart Barber seeks re-election against Mike Stone

Pastor Bart Barber of First Baptist, Farmersville, Texas, will be nominated for a second one-year term as President. Mike Stone, pastor of First Baptist, Blackshear, Georgia, as of this printing, appears to be Barber's only challenger. Stone was nominated two years ago in Nashville, but narrowly lost to Ed Litton.

NAMB Church Planting 'Class of 2022' pushes SBC past 10,000 new churches planted since 2010



Southern Baptists planted 745 churches in 2022, 106 of which were replants. There were also 46 second campus locations launched and 126 churches that newly affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention, for a total of 917 new congregations added to the convention in 2022.



Still no President of the Executive Committee in Nashville

Some awkwardness came in a special called EC meeting in May as the Search Committee unanimously brought a candidate to the entire Committee for a vote. In an unprecedented move, the Executive Committee voted down Texas Pastor Jared Wellman 50-31 as its next President. Wellman had been a past chairman of the EC. Tensions surrounding the vote included the fact that Wellman was a member of the search team until he recused himself in late January in order for

his name to be submitted as a candidate. Willie McLaurin continues to serve as interim President.

New Ethnic Research Network to be introduced at annual meeting

Minh Ha Nguyen, with the IMB has been gathering data for twenty years on changes within the Convention. "We're more diverse than people realize and we're going to showcase that. We want to tell the ethnic story of what God is doing globally from a minority perspective," Nguyen stated. Also **Hispanic Baptists** are planning for evangelistic events at Crossover New Orleans, along with a time of fellowship and equipping



opportunities for pastors. A first-ever meeting of Myanmar (Burmese) Baptist churches is one of many Asian gatherings in New Orleans. **The Asian Collective,** comprised of more than 2,000 SBC churches and representing 27 nationalities, "brings new hope in fulfilling the Great Commission as they are committed to reaching the fast-growing Asian population with the Gospel," said Peter Yanes, Vice President with Asian relations of the Executive Committee.





NYC Church unveils "God Is Trans" Exhibit

THE BAPTIST FAITH & MESSAGE

What We Believe as Southern Baptists

We continue with our series on the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, with this month's column.

Article III: Man

"Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image. He created them male and female as the crowning work of His creation. The gift of gender is thus part of the goodness of God's creation. In the beginning man was innocent of sin and was endowed by his Creator with freedom of choice. By his free choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. Through the temptation of Satan man transgressed the command of God, and fell from his original innocence whereby his posterity inherit a nature and an environment inclined toward sin. Therefore, as soon as they are capable of moral action, they become transgressors and are under condemnation. Only the grace of God can bring man into His holy fellowship and enable man to fulfill the creative purpose of God. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ died for man; therefore, every person of every race possesses full dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love."

God's crowning act of creation occurred when "the LORD God formed man out of the dust from the ground and breathed the breath of life into his nostrils, and the man became a living being." Gen. 2:7.

Every person, regardless of ethnicity, gender, age, abilities, socioeconomic class, or even behavior retains God-given worth and dignity. We are set apart from the rest of creation, and His work of redemption is directed specifically to the salvation of men and women who have been tarnished by sin.

God's glory is revealed in the distinctions between men and women. God took Eve from Adam's side, not his head or feet. Men and women best glorify God when they carry out the complementary roles He has given them. The gender chaos that prevails in modern society grieves the heart of God.

All people are born with an inclination to sin, and all people act upon this tendency to live independently of God through willful rebellion against Him. This alienates people from God and merits His divine justice. (Romans 3:10, 23, 6:23)

God sent His Son to redeem us. Jesus' sinless life, sacrificial and substitutionary death on the cross, and physical resurrection from the dead purchased the salvation of all who repent and trust in Him.
