IS OUR WORLD OVER RUN WITH CRISES?

Five lessons we can learn from the prophet Daniel

In every facet of life, we see new weekly crises in front of us, from issues in our own city and nation, to overseas wars and rumors of war. Our hearts hurt when we see the breakdown of society with rolling shootouts in Shreveport and tragedies like the recent school shooting in Nashville.

In his day, the prophet Daniel had his hands full with one crisis after another. He was a great model in how to pray through a crisis in his life. Here are some lessons on how Daniel prayed.

- 1. Daniel listened to God.** We listen to God by being in His Word. In *Daniel 9:2*, he is reading God's promise from Jeremiah to bring back the Israelites to Jerusalem. Help your church focus on God's Word during trying times.
- 2. Daniel focused his attention on God.** Daniel did this physically in *Daniel 9:3*, "I set my face toward the Lord God." Could it be that the reason a crisis causes us more harm than normal is that we are looking at ourselves and other things rather than God?
- 3. Daniel expressed his desires with emotion.** In *Daniel 9:3*, the prophet did more than make his requests known to God. Daniel pleaded with God through fasting, sackcloth and ashes. Show God that your prayer is more than a passing request, but that it is the passion of your heart.
- 4. Daniel thanked God for his love and promises.** As we help our church members navigate a crisis, encourage them to express their gratitude to God. *Daniel 9:4*. Thankfulness helps us see beyond our problems.
- 5. Daniel confessed his own sin and sin of his countrymen.** In *Daniel 9:5*, he specifically mentioned what the people of Israel had done wrong. He knew that God's help would only come because of His grace, not because they deserved it.

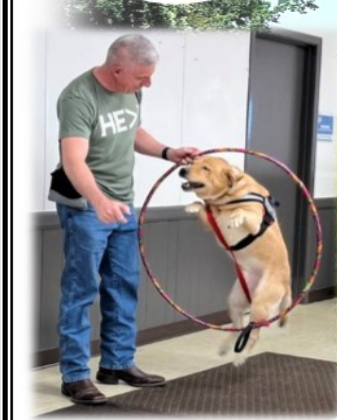

Loneliness Speeds Aging More Than Smoking

Recent data gathered from biometrics and blood samples

from 12,000 men and women found that feeling hopeless, unhappy, and lonely increased biological age more than smoking. An international team of experts says that the biological clock is damaged by unhappiness, increasing the risk for Alzheimers, heart disease, diabetes and other illnesses. *"Mental and psycho-social states are some of the most robust predictors of health outcomes and quality of life, yet they have been largely omitted from modern healthcare,"* said study author Manuel Faria of Stanford University.

Southern Baptists Remove Saddleback Church Over Female Pastor

The SBC Executive Committee voted to remove Saddleback, along with four other churches, as "not in friendly cooperation" with the denomination. The move came after recently retired pastor Rick Warren ordained three women as pastors defying Biblical principles and Article VI in the Baptist Faith & Message. Article VI reads, *"While both men and women are gifted for service in the church, the office of the pastor is limited to men as qualified by scripture."*

Johnny Hunt Sues SBC, Executive Committee, & Guidepost

Longtime pastor and former SBC President Johnny Hunt, has filed a lawsuit seeking unspecified damages related to allegations of defamation and the invasion of privacy based on accusations made against Hunt in the 2022 Guidepost report stemming from an investigation into the alleged mishandling of sexual abuse by the EC. While the suit, which demands a jury trial, does not specially list a financial amount desired for damages, it states, *"Hunt's life was forever changed when the Defendants publically released their report.. He lost his job; he lost income from speaking engagements; and he lost income from publishing opportunities, and the Defendants should be held liable."*

We continue with our series on the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, with this month's column.

Article II-C: God The Holy Spirit

"The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine. He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgement. He calls men to the Saviour, and effects regeneration. At the moment of regeneration He baptizes every believer, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals every believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the guarantee that God will bring the believer into the fullness of the stature of Christ. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service."

In some ways, the Holy Spirit is the neglected, if not forgotten, member of the Trinity. However, it is important for us to understand how thoroughly the Bible depicts both the personhood and deity of the Holy Spirit.

One of the clearest demonstrations of the Holy Spirit's personality is the use of personal pronouns in reference to himself. Acts 10:19-20 and Acts 13:1-2 both give evidence of the Holy Spirit speaking personally to Peter as well as to the believers in the Antioch church. These are the actions of a cognitive, perceptive being, not an impersonal force.

In John 16:13-14, Jesus also uses personal pronouns to speak of the Holy Spirit. *"When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you unto all the truth. For He will not speak on His own, but He will speak whatever He hears. He will also declare to you what is to come. He will glorify Me, because He will take from what is Mine and declare it to you."*

According to Jesus, the Holy Spirit arrives, guides, discerns the truth, hears and speaks, discloses future events, testifies about Jesus, and glorifies him - all demonstrations of personhood.

A faithful look at God's Word leads us to the conclusion that the Holy Spirit is an equal partner with the Father and the Son in the Godhead. His role in the creation, redemption, and the revealing of Scripture is distinct yet inseparable from the work of the other members of the Trinity.
