

## Go and Make Disciples... by Knowing

The more I serve the local church, the more I am convinced that we are creating drive-by relational experiences. Perhaps we are as consumer driven as our culture. Often, I hear pastors talking about their attendance numbers. financial numbers, baptism numbers and what music was played. Are these the categories by which church health is to be measured? Of course, we pray to have more people rather than less people who are responding to the gospel, but aren't genuine converts Christ followers?

The words of Jesus recorded in Mathew 28:19-20, speak of going, making, baptizing, and teaching. If being a Christ follower/disciple means going and making other disciples, how are we doing? To be frank, WHERE did you go and WHO did you make a disciple this past month? Every born-again follower of Christ, not just the professionals, are called to go and make. I love what Paul told Timothy in 2 Timothy 2:2. He wanted Timothy to find men who could train other men to do the work of the ministry. Timothy, like Paul, did not train complete strangers.

So, the question is, "How is a person known?" I know we have people all around us that we know by name, but we really don't know them. My heart breaks for those who come but who are never known. Think of the loners, those in the crowd who come every week but are never really known. I am reminded of a verse that has become so meaningful for me. Paul wrote in Philippians 3:10, "that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to his death." Paul understood that knowing Christ meant suffering and dving to self. If knowing Christ meant this for Paul, what would it take to truly know the people around us?

In order to have someone pattern your lifestyle, or become a disciple, you must live a life worth following. In addition, you must get to know the person you intend to disciple. Lately, I have been challenging people with this thought, "You really don't know a person unless you know how they like their steak cooked." In other words, unless you walked with a person or heard a person's story, do not assume you know them. Do you want to be fully known? Really? Truly knowing a person will get messy and complicated. Knowing someone means walking in their shoes and helping them when they fall. Knowing someone means rejoicing when they achieve a goal and not being jealous of their good fortune.

Making disciples has to be more than what the church is doing today. It has to be more than Christian consumerism. Why are we developing followers who are asking what a church has to offer them, rather what they bring to the church? Where are the Christ followers who are called to a church and are compelled to live out the calling God has placed upon them? I believe it starts with knowing people. Over this past year, I have heard multiple guests express that they have attended several churches where they have not been greeted warmly or spoken to by the pastor. God is sending people to the church to make as His disciples. What are we doing with them? Maybe He is sending more than we are going. Nonetheless, people are coming to our churches to be fully known by us, and it must be our aim to see them come to know Christ and to know the power of His resurrection! What can you do this week to RE-ALLY know the people you see every week? Don't just look for the familiar faces. Leave the familiar and reach out to the unfamiliar!
