

have never forgotten some information that I received as a teenager many years ago. Some of the information that I still remember was given to me by teachers, football coaches, Sunday school teachers and our pastor. However, the information or advice that I am thinking about today was given to me by a crusty old man (I am now older than he was). He was my boxing coach. The advice that he gave me has served me well all through my life in a variety of situations. Let me share it with you.

His advice to me was simple. "Rocky, you do not have to be the

fastest! It is not necessary for you to be the strongest! However, you can be the toughest!" I have used that little piece of information or encouragement in ministry over and over again.

Your church might not be the largest. Your opportunity might not be the brightest. But you can succeed if you will just stay in there and not quit. Don't give up. Continue to do what you know to do and do that the very best that you can until the final bell sounds!

There have been times in my ministry when I might have given in to the temptation not to work so hard or just to give up. But those words kept me in the fight. Maybe we are on the wrong side of town. Maybe we don't have a lot of new folks moving in our area. Who cares! Just keep Preaching, Praying and Singing! God has promised to bless the preaching of the Bible. I don't know how to do anything else. I can still hear that mentor in my life saying to me-"You do not have to be the fastest. You do not have to be the strongest. You can be the toughest!"

Dr. B.J. "Rocky" Maddox has been pastor at Rose Park for 32 years. The church has been enjoying record Sunday School attendance, averaging over 350.
