
## **IS IT TIME TO RAISE THE** WHITE FLAG ON THE **CULTURE WAR?**

Even with our small group God showed up and did what He does. Praise His Name. Keep praying as we keep serving Him!



**Focused on Jesus** Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith

If we expect to ever be what Christ saved us to become, we are going to need to learn how to avoid the distractions of the everyday activities of life here on planet earth. The relentless pursuit of the American dream as a lifestyle has overwhelmed and hindered far too many of us in the church today. When I woke up this morning I had to make a choice that each of us must make each and everyday. I

learn to focus our minds on what is best for us. I cannot think of anything greater to **focus** on each day than Jesus Christ and His Word. I have discovered that when I remain focused on Jesus life seems much more manageable and rewarding. Jesus said to seek first His kingdom and His righteousness and all of our needs would be given to us (Matthew 6:33). To seek after something requires us to focus upon that which we are seeking. If we truly desire to live for God, we must focus upon Jesus the author and finisher of our faith. The Apostle Paul said, If then you were raised with Christ, seek (focus on) those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind (focus) on things above, not on things on the earth. (Colossians 3:1-2) Many of us want to do God's will, but we fail to focus.
