# WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO AMERICA'S YOUNG MEN?

Every born again believer already knows the answer

In recent years we have watched one young man after another attempt mass carnage or threaten

violence in some city in America. Sadly, on several occasions, they have been successful. No venue is off limits, not even our churches. These tragedies make national news, but the reality is that every weekend in major cities, hundreds of people are shot or killed, and most of these incidents rarely make news because they involve only one or two individuals at a time.

We are now seeing the fruit of half a century of secularizing America. From the 1960's when prayer and the Bible were jettisoned from our schools as unconstitutional, to today's classroom lessons on determining your true gender and same sex partners, we shouldn't be surprised at the harvest we're seeing. When a nation revels in its rebellion and sin, what else could we expect? "The wicked strut about when what is vile is honored among men." Psalm 12:8

The family unit is becoming an endangered species. With the proliferation of fatherless families, and a mom doing the best she can, young men are left to make their own way in society. Boys are growing up in a purposeless world where they have no value, and are taught they're simply a collection of chemicals that can be easily disposed of by abortion. No future, no judgement. "There is a way which seems right to a man, but in the end is the way of death." Proverbs 14:12

The restraint that once governed the hearts of young men (the acknowledgment of God's existence, a coming day of judgement, and some idea of right and wrong) has been removed by the learned elitists of our day.

I recently came across a seventy-five year old booklet printed by our former Baptist Sunday School Board, entitled, "Why Every Boy Needs a Man In His Life." Its content seems innocent and naive by today's standard. However, it contains timeless principles. A boy should have a mentor that he looks up to. A boy should have a man to instill confidence and encouragement in him and eventually lead him to Christ. That man should teach life lessons and how to be productive. A boy needs a man to walk him through adolescence, the emotions he will experience, and how to deal with them. That man should also show him how to treat a young lady. The world will laugh and scoff at those ideas, but I believe those values and



insights from the 1940's will still work today if practiced.

A godly generation of Spirit filled men must rise up. Invest in a young man that God puts in your life. The next generation will be lost if we don't.

While staying in this home, the boys will participate in their Kingdom Men Program,

individual/ group counseling, reading/writing summer program, tutoring/ after-school program, as well as many other recreational/leisure activities. The ministry works closely with the families, school system, juvenile services, and the community to bring about the desired change in the lives of these young men.

As with any ministry, the needs are great and ongoing. Here is a list of some major items that are needed: 15 passenger van, towels, soap, dishwashing liquid, deodorant (boys), toothpaste, 24 toothbrushes, cleaning supplies, mop/broom, socks, t-shirts, underwear (boys 12-17), trash bags, light bulbs, laundry detergent, and hand soap.

# A Pastor's Perspective

#### DON'T FORGET TO LOVE

If we had been around to be contacted by the First Baptist Church of Ephesus for a resume in the year 96 AD, most of us would have been very excited. To serve a church founded a short time before by the great Apostle Paul, served by the powerful preacher Apollos, possibly even to be the successor to Timothy, would have been awesome to be mentioned as one thought worthy Salem Baptist Church, to minister to such a historic group. Some there might even be a part of the original group of founders.

Look at the praise heaped on them by Jesus in the record of John. To the eye they were a dedicated group of believers determined to stay clear of the doctrine of the Nicolaitans. For sure, they were personally committed to moral purity and expected all of their fellowship to share that commitment. Jesus gave recognition to their dedication to labor for Him, (Rev 2:2-3) "I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance, and how you cannot bear with those who are evil, but have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false. I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for my name's sake, and you have not grown weary." (ESV) What a fascinating opportunity, a church filled with God-fearing, faithful workers who have stayed true to the doctrinal guidance of Paul. There was no chance of being misled by those who would try to change the word they had been given. It at least appears they were as dedicated to the Word as were the Bereans.

This was a great church, with a great history, serving in one of the most challenging environments of the era. In the midst of our excitement the crushing words of Jesus would tend to "burst our bubble." (Rev 2:4) "Nevertheless I have *somewhat* against thee, because thou hast left thy first love." (KJV)

Over the years I have heard several ideas about this "first love" but remain convinced of the real problem. They were doing all the right things, but were doing them without a heart of love. Jesus really summed up our responsibility when he instructed the questioning lawyer, Matt. 22:37... "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind."

I suspect that many of the problems our churches and ministers experience today can be traced to this same issue. Too often churches seem to be doing the "right thing" out of a sense of duty, without the heart of love expected by God. We can meet regularly, give faithfully, pray dramatically, present the Word powerfully, but without the heart of love, doing "the right thing" just translates to religious activity without success

The high attrition rate for ministers can likely be traced to this same lack. The ritual of ministry becomes the "duty" rather than the labor of love - love for God, love for God's Word and love for God's people.

In Jesus' last lessons before His betrayal (John 13-17), four times He instructed them (us) to love one another. There is a very encouraging promise of love in John 15:9 with the admonition for them (us) to serve in love. "As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love." And in His prayer for them (us) He closed with this, (John 17:26) "And I have declared unto them thy name, and will declare it: that the love wherewith thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them." So, while we are living in AD 2019 not AD 96, may God help us, Pastors and Churches, to love the work, the Word, and one another like
